

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INTRODUCTION

A RECIPE FOR PLAY!

After the conference I was lucky to attend Susie Monday's workshop in Newberg. Susie explores the "Sensory Alphabet" to shake up our understanding of art basics. She offered an action-packed day filled with simple short exercises. Fifteen-minute drills designed to unlock our brains and allow us to understand our artistic marks more intuitively.

Need a prompt to play? Here are just a few examples I gathered from the workshop:

- Line Lay out large sheets of paper. Make any line your mind can imagine. Grab unfamiliar materials and experiment. Don't judge your marks in that moment. Just hang the paper on the wall and walk away. See what speaks in a new light or at another time.
- Space Work big. Work vertical. Fill a space with marks, shapes, and/or color. Work all the way to the edges.
- Shape Explore a shape without a pad and pen. Touch an object. Feel its shape. Picture the shape with your eyes closed. Then recreate this shape by tearing paper, cutting freehand with scissors, or mold it from whatever is around.
- Color Gather images or samples of colors that intrigue you. Using inexpensive paints in primary colors, mix the paint to match a color. Repeat...Repeat...
- Sound Listen to the sounds of your world and interpret them in line or color. As the wind rustles in the trees what marks come to mind? Or how can you translate familiar or unfamiliar melodies onto paper? What is the rhythm of the marks?

ortland SAQA member and multi-media artist Lulu Moonwood Murakami will speak about her artistic processes working in different media and how they come together as a body of work.

In Lulu's own words from her website, www.lulumoonart.com:

"I have an insatiable appetite for color, pattern, and texture. I find them irresistible as I take in my visual and tactile surroundings. Some of my inspirations include traditional and contemporary folk art, autumn leaves trembling beneath steel blue skies, overgrown gardens, skeins of dyed yarn nested in baskets, and traditional ethnic costumes rich in pattern and adornments. Juxtapositions of colors and contrasts of textures exhilarate my senses as well as my psyche. Through textile and mixed media arts I am able to bring many of these influences together. Working with prints, patterns, and bold colors, I use stitching, painting, and embellishments to build a rich, tactile surface that evokes emotion and memory. "

his month we will be discussing our Regional Conference and plotting topics for future meetings. Let's brainstorm while we are inspired and discover where we want to go together.






MEMBER NEWS

LISA FLOWERS ROSS

Field Studies: Interpreting the West, a solo exhibition of artwork by **Lisa Flowers Ross**, will open at the *Visions Museum of Textile Art* in San Diego, CA, on October 13th, at the same time as the <u>Interpretations</u> exhibition. Her **Field Studies** body of work is inspired by specific locations in the western states. Using varying degrees of abstraction and her own hand-dyed fabrics, Flowers Ross has created natural landscapes from Arizona, California, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah and Wyoming. The exhibition in San Diego will be through December 30, 2023.

She is also currently showing a body of work inspired by nature at the *Initial Point Gallery* in Meridian, ID. Nine of her artworks are included in the exhibition, <u>Heaven on Earth</u>, alongside artworks by Suzanne DeSoleil and Leslie Jay Bosch. JANET HILLER


Family Dynamics has been juried into Art Quilts: Breaking Rules, Honoring Tradition, at the *Vision Gallery* in Chandler, Arizona.

GLENDA MAH

Glenda Mah's work, 5 Masks, has been accepted to the 11th Annual International 2023 FL3TCH3R Exhibit:
Social and Politically Engaged Art displayed from October 2 to December 8, 2023, at the Reece Museum on the campus of East Tennessee State University.

This piece contains the names of 115 unarmed individuals that were killed by police. There are 115 fractured shapes. I used hand dyed fabric for the background and hand dyed fabric sheets collaged to create the dimensional masks. The red tears were created individually by R. Bigelow and presented to me as a gift for the piece. This piece acknowledges the loss of life and the fractured lives surrounding these deaths. Families were torn by grief; communities were fractured and important issues were brought to light. The masks represent the shared grief over the loss of life and affected communities. Fractured masks represent the destruction of life and emotions. The tears were shed and continue to be shed - hopefully leading to healing through shared grief.

Hope for change to come. 3' x 4'

Glenda's Shibori work **Lines and Spaces** has been accepted to the <u>Hagi International Shibori Tapestry Exhibition</u> in Hagi, Japan, October 27-November 1, 2023.

The exhibit will then move to Nagoya and then Arimatsu for the <u>Spring Shibori Festival</u> (dates to be announced). Whole cloth stitched resist shibori on linen, 100 cm x 180 cm
