

- SAQA Oregon Regional Exhibition. Booking venues for an exhibition requires a couple of years in advanced planning, which means we are beginning the process for the next exhibit in 2024.
- SAQA Oregon 2025 Regional Conference. Planning ahead also is required for the Regional Conference. I was on this committee for the 2023 conference. I never felt overworked and enjoyed working with the committee to make it happen.
- Local Connections. Our local connections work so well because we involve so many. The PDX Local Connection is moving to a 5-member group-leadership committee without a primary facilitator. It is modeled after Central Oregon's leadership group that has worked well. PDX is looking for a few more people to round out their committee, specifically for program planning. The other local connections will also be changing out leadership as the year progresses.
- SAQA Oregon Regional Trunk Show. Sheryl LeBlanc has put together
  a prospectus for us to build a regional trunk show. The intent of this
  trunk show is to travel around the state to events that will introduce a
  variety of groups to the wonder and amazement of art quilts.

It will be on view at Grace Hudson Museum, Ukiah, California, from October 29, 2023 - March 17, 2024.




#### KATHIE KERLER

I'm really enjoying working on smaller pieces and experimenting with various techniques, fibers, and the concept of a fiber book. I've become intrigued with owls this year, as they are beautiful, amazing hunters, and masters of camouflage!
