

MAKE GREAT THINGS HAPPEN AS A SAQA REP

After almost 2 years, it is time for me to step down from my position as one of our two SAQA Oregon REPS. It's been a fascinating job and remarkably rewarding. Looking back, although I retired to focus on my myself and my art, it's the connection with others that has most enriched my life. This has been a great experience.

Often this position is filled by a former facilitator for our local connections or a committee chair. After hearing a poignant comment during a recent call, I see that we should open up this opportunity to our region's talented and diverse membership. Our region is successfully humming along. And this is a great time for new ideas.

What is a SAQA REP?

A SAQA REP is the liaison between SAQA Global and their local region. An Oregon REP shares events, activities, and policies between the head office and our Oregon membership.

What does a REP do?

The REP job is about communication. The REP attends 2 -4 Zoom calls a month. The most creative call is the Oregon steering committee where we plan our local activities. The best call for connection is the international REP call where we hear from SAQA Global and interact with the regions worldwide. The 2 CO-REPS divide and attend other calls for our exhibits and conferences as needed. We also monitor the budget and membership changes for the region. Our goal is to observe these activities and build consistency with SAQA Global's programs. The side benefit is great connections with fellow artists.

But I'm new to SAQA. Do I have to be a member for a long time?

SAQA provides a training program that can get any member up to speed quickly. Also, SAQA staff is readily available if questions arise. But the real fun is that our friends and members are eager and willing to share the history and ideas. There are so many helping hands. One is never alone in this job.

Won't this interfere with my artwork?

That's not a problem. This job is what you make of it. The basics of oversight and communication take about 4-6 hours a month. A REP can be more involved in additional creative projects if she or he is interested. More importantly, this job provides tremendous access to an amazing array of artists. My artwork and confidence are so much broader and richer because of the artists I've worked with in the past two years.

Can I ask questions without committing?

Absolutely! SAQA Oregon is a region that works well because we all work together. Kat and I are happy to chat and help you find the best fit for you. Email or text anytime.




